Activities





The project's activities include, among others, the creation of Inclusive Zones - hundreds of public buildings and spaces that are designated as being open, accessible and welcoming to people regardless of their ethnic or national background, gender, disability or sexual orientation.





An educational project is implemented targeting physical education teachers and sports coaches from all types of educational institutions. promoting the idea of creating environments which reject racism and intolerance.





Streetkick mobile games will be taking place in the host cities and will provide a platform for interaction between fans and create a positive atmosphere during the tournament.
